King's Christian Collegiate

Bursary Information – September 2026

King's mission is to equip all students "to grow in wisdom and stature and in favour with God and people

"(Luke 2:52). The King's bursary program is designed to give access to students and families who desire a King's Christian Collegiate education but may be limited by financial realities. From inception, King's has maintained a clearly stated strategic goal to welcome families from a wide range of incomes to participate fully in the King's program.

King's requests all applications for tuition and transportation relief be made through Apple Financial Services (AFS). <https://www.applefinancialservices.ca/>. King's currently uses Apple Financial Services to provide an arm's length unbiased evaluation of the applicant's financial resources and ability to fund tuition. In providing a recommendation, it is expected that the family are prepared to contribute as much as possible towards the education costs as financial assistance is not offered to supplement or enhance the lifestyle of the family.

- In making an offer of a bursary, the Kings Bursary Committee will consider all the following information:
 - AFS recommendation based on the financial data provided by the applicant family.
 - Previous year bursary if applicable.
 - Amount requested.
 - Christian school background.
 - Extenuating circumstances e.g. loss of job; child with disability.
 - Family Status.
 - Other tuition obligations.
 - Unpaid tuition from previous school year.
- There is no financial relief available for the Capital Levy.
- King's makes no provision for bursaries based on giftedness in athletics, academics, music or other abilities.
- If there is a need, an application must be made every school year in accordance with the time-line specified.
- The committee will not offer a bursary in excess of 75% tuition except in very exceptional circumstances.
- The Bursary Committee will keep confidential all information received through this process.
- King's expects all bursary recipients to keep confidential the value of any bursary granted.
- The King's Board of Directors receives an annual report listing all bursaries granted. The report does not provide the names of the recipient families.
- There is a processing fee charged by Apple Financial Services. King's will provide a waiver code to all **returning** families which covers the cost of the processing fee.
